

Looking for a book to read? If you're in your 20's, check out "The Defining Decade: Why your Twenties matter – and how to make the most of them now," by Meg Jay, PhD. Below is a description:

Our "thirty-is-the-new-twenty" culture tells us the twentysomething years don't matter. Some say they are a second adolescence. Others call them an emerging adulthood. Dr. Meg Jay, a clinical psychologist, argues that twentysomethings have been caught in a swirl of hype and misinformation, much of which has trivialized what is actually the most defining decade of adulthood.

The result is a provocative read that provides the tools necessary to make the most of your twenties, and shows us how work, relationships, personality, social networks, identity, and even the brain can change more during this decade than at any other time in adulthood-if we use the time wisely.

Growing Young Assessment

WPC & TUCO have partnered with the Fuller Youth Institute in a research study called Growing Young. Each congregation completed a survey last month to determine how we can more effectively meet the needs of our younger-aged congregation, and in turn, grow our congregation younger.
